Those iPads that were purchased for students have remained in the schools and are available for use with resource teachers delassroom teachers.

8. Regional Parents Reaching Out Grant

Daphne led the group in a discussion regarding the possibilitapplying for a regional Parents Reaching Out (PR@)ant. PRO Grants are designed to support parents in identifying barriers to parent engagement in their own community and to find local solutions to involve more parents in support of student achievement, human rights and equity, and *brelhg.
