The Mental Health Services dept. is working virtually and discussions have taken place to determine when flace visits can resume. Clients has adapted well to virtual visits thus far. Scheduling appointments during school hours has been a struggle so this year. Some school boards have set up virtual rooms for school hours visits with children.
